Ballot Question 1: What makes you qualified for this position? Why are you interested in this position?

Through my background holding a number of positions at ACNM at both a local and national level, I believe I am qualified for this position because I have interacted extensively with board members and have seen the qualities that are required for leadership. I believe that it is time for ACNM to meet the next generation of midwives where they are at. We need to be engaging across platforms and communities. We need to be present in midwifery education programs, at affiliates, but also out in the public. ACNM serves midwives and we need to make sure that whether a midwife is a member or not, they see and hear from us.

Ballot Question 5: What are two improvements that ACNM should prioritize and how would you help address them in your role?

First, ACNM should be listening to more students and new midwives. Allowing students to vote needs to be just the first step. We should be creating open spaces for them to engage, whether virtually or in person. In my role, I want to nominate those who see creative way to reach out to these new midwives.

Second, ACNM should be re-imagining its conference, making it an attractive engagement point for midwives. Midwives are looking not just for CMEs, but for deeper connections including career networking, innovative technology, and support organizing to change within their communities.
